A LENSMAN'S VIEW OF THE WORLD

Christopher Roche explores different faiths by highlighting the common humanity shared by believers.

The Canadian photographer's work explores ancient religious traditions that are threatened by factors such as globalisation and climate change. Roche – who has lived in Africa and Europe, and now resides in London – has published two photographic books on this theme. His images have been exhibited at the Royal Geographical Society in London and the United Nations office in Geneva. The award-winning lensman is inspired by artists such as Rembrandt and Caravaggio, and this is reflected in his painterly and cinematic photographs.

TIGRAY, ETHIOPIA Having researched the sun's trajectory, I scaled a cliff and found the priest of a hidden cave church. I encouraged him to ignore me, and caught this relaxed portrait of him, even though we were both on the edge of a precipice.



TAYANCANI, PERU

Having trekked alongside thousands of pilgrims through a wintry night at high altitude, I was rewarded with a sungreeting ceremony at dawn. I positioned myself so I could capture the pilgrims' descent from the mountains.

SINAQARA, PERU

High in the Andes, pilgrims known as ukuku dressed in costume and engaged in a contest using whips. I got down low and used a wide-angle lens to reveal the musicians, spectators and mountains in the background.

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
VARANASI, INDIA
